

Governor's Message

Dear Fellow Lions,

"We're on the road again!" We have been keeping busy and it has been a good "busy". We have visited 12 clubs so far and I have inducted 5 new members. My greatest pleasure was inducting 2 new members into the North Accomack Club, which gave them a 33% increase in membership.

When this newsletter comes out we will have had 3 very successful region meetings and will have visited many very active clubs. We have found that the clubs in District 24-D are very caring and are helping those less fortunate than ourselves. To set and example there were 30 Lions that participated in the RAM Expedition in Wise County in July with a total of 255 from around the state. The statistics of the number of people they helped is over whelming. For example - eye exams, 399; eye exams with glasses, 710; teeth extractions, 3,485; fillings, 2,039; cleanings, 284; general medical, 3,799 (includes hearing); mammograms, 83; for a total patient treatment of 6,397.

The month of September we will be a busy one, too. Besides the official visits there is the USA/Canada Leadership Forum in Peoria.

October is just around the corner and our Fall Conference is October 14 and 15 at the Renaissance Hotel in Portsmouth. We just received the official word that Lion Mahendra Amarasuriya, Second Vice President of Lions International wil be our International guest. So we need everyone possible to attend this Fall Conference and show him what a great District 24-D is.

I am including the Mission 30 Goals so that everyone can be working on them, strengthening and growing our clubs by striving to accomplish each of these goals.

- 8. To encourage reorganization of status quo clubs.

- 16. To encourage clubs to use the proper induction ceremony for new members.

- 18. To enhance visibility of Lions Clubs through Effective Public Relations.
- 19. To encourage Districts to utilize Public Relations Grants.
- 20. To encourage each District to enroll a minimum of 5 Melvin Jones Fellows.
- 21. To encourage clubs to present Membership Kits to all new members.
- 22. To encourage the extension of ethnic clubs.
- 23. To encourage participation in Academy Awards of Lionism.
- 24. To promote the "Star Awards Program".
- 25. To educate Districts on the procedures to claim "Star Awards"
- 26. To encourage members to understand and embrace Lions Code of Ethics.
- 27. To set new standards and benchmarks by encouraging the clubs to undertake long-term service projects.
- 28. To encourage Past District Governors to support the "Plus One" initiative.
- 29. To encourage District and Multiple "MERL" teams, and other special appointees, to implement the "Passion to Grow" program.
- 30. To encourage Districts to have proper Recognition Programs.

Five Beach Clubs take Sight and Hearing Unit to the Oceanfront to Screen the Homeless

On Sunday, May 15, Bayside, Kempsville, Oceanside, Virginia Beach Host and Woodstock Lions in partnership with Forefront Church screened about 60 homeless for sight, hearing, eye pressure, diabetes and high blood pressure. Individual Lions participating were: Bayside Lions Club – Bob Dickerson, Joe Gorman, Jim Laughlin, John Reveley, Tom Walsh and Charles Wood; Kempsville Lions Club – Dave Booz, Bob Nery, Minnie Nery and Steve Rosnov; Oceanside Lions Club – John Cranford, Nancy Cranford, Ronnie Saunders, Mary Saunders and Roy Stockdill; Virginia Beach Host Lions Club – Duke Ceclic, Bruce Dowe, Carman Freeburn, Gene Harrison, Nancy Harrison and Bob Hayes; Woodstock Lions Club – Carolyn Ficken, Al Hoover, Mel Stauffer and Christine Stauffer.

According to a recent article in The Virginian-Pilot, it has been estimated that we have nearly 870 adults and children in Virginia Beach identified as homeless. These people aren't transients, they are people who are living and working here and doing the best they can. Bad credit and mounting debt block many from permanent housing – challenges that, for some, started with a job layoff, an unpaid utility bill or an unexpected visit to the hospital.

We now have the opportunity to provide eyeglasses and hearing aids to the many homeless in need. (Fortunately, of the 60 screened for diabetes by Lion Roberto Loya and the nurses provided by Forefront Church none were found to have diabetes.) There was one young man screened who cannot get his drivers license until he gets a pair of eyeglasses. If we can get an optometrist to see these people and the use of an automatic refractor we will be able to use used eyeglasses from our Eyeglass Recycling Center or better yet, if the clubs in Virginia Beach join together we can provide exams and new eyeglasses for these people in need. Wouldn't it be great to let these people know they are important and there is someone who cares? If your club can help with this project please contact Lions Bob and Minnie Nery at 471-5566 or e-mail nery@cox.net.

Note: Of the 60 screened for vision there were 15 in the 20/40 range and 13 in the 20/50 range all the way up to 20/200; and there were 5 with an eye pressure over 20. We also had one person whose hearing was extremely low.

Official Minutes of District 24-D First Full Cabinet Meeting Sentara Norfolk General Hospital July 24, 2005

District Governor Lion Barbara Senecal called the First Cabinet meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. Lion Moon Kosjer, PID explained arrangements and thanked the hospital for the use of the facilities. The Patriotic Song was led by Lion Debbie Ivey, IPDG, the pledge was led by Lion Clayt' Senecal, PDG and the invocation was given by Lion Jim Oglesby, PDG.

Lion Bobbie Carroll, Cabinet Secretary, took roll call with 61/95 cabinet members present. (This is on file with the minutes.)

A roll call of all the clubs was taken with 41/57 clubs in attendance. (This is on file with the minutes.)

Roll call was taken of the Past District Governors of which there were 13 in attendance.

Before starting old business the District Governor recognized Lion Moon, PID who made a motion that we have a quorum of this cabinet meeting and of the Charity Foundation and the Sight and Hearing Meeting. The motion was seconded and passed. A motion was made regarding the voting eligibility of the Club representatives. The parliamentarian rules that the motion was not in order. A revised motion citing that the extended cabinet be granted voting privileges of the immediate cabinet. Motion was seconded and approved.

Old Business:

A motion was made that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the Cabinet Meeting held May 27, 2005 and accept them as they were presented in the Knight's Vision newsletter in July. The motion was seconded and approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Lion Bud Warren, PDG and copies distributed. In the Administrative Fund there is a deficit in the Answering Service-Peninsula which the District Governor is aware of and will take care of. There was a surplus of \$800 ahead of last year. Lion Bud presented the Activities Fund with a concern with the Diabetes-Camp Fund. A lot more money was spent than taken in last year. A motion regarding the money for the Honduras Project, for the record, that the District makes sure the monies are spent in an appropriate manner. A motion was made and seconded to accept the Year End Treasurer's report. Approved

The District Governor presented the District 24-D State Budget as submitted by Lion Arlen Eidson, PDG. A motion was made for the budget's adoption as presented. The motion was seconded and approved by the full cabinet.

District Governor Lion Barbara presented her goals for 2005-06. She emphasized the need to increase our membership from 1750 to 1850. She also would like every club to participate in the District Achievement Contest but mainly to have fun and enjoy Lionism. Lion Barbara supports the International Director goals and of the Mission 30 goals, District 24-D has already accomplished two thirds of them. The main goal is for every club in 24-D to have a great year and grow in Lionism.

New Business:

Bland: Lion Ellen Bovee presented the budget and asked that at the Region level the Clubs in that Region pay for the expenses of the Bland Contest. What monies are left over in the budget goes to the State for scholarships. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the bland budget. (report on file)

Diabetes Awareness: Lion Roberto Loya presented his budget. Lion Roberto estimated income based on 2,000 Lions at \$3 per member. He was asked to reduce the income as we only have 1750 members. Lion Roberto is hoping to increase other donations. A motion was made to accept the budget with the reduced income. It was seconded and passed. (report on file)

Diabetes Camp: The budget for the Diabetes Camp was presented by Lion Chet Kramer. There was a question from the floor as to why the Diabetes Camp spent approximately \$8,000 more then it took in last year. Not all the clubs last year gave money to this program and what will be done this year to make a difference? Lion Chet said that 30 days prior to the camp if the money is not there, they will have

to cut back on the number of campers they can accept. Lion Moon, PID made a motion to accept this budget as this is an important project and we should sacrifice other things to finance it. The motion was seconded and passed. (report on file)

Governor's Newsletter: Lion Sue Parr presented the Governor's Newsletter budget. Last years budget started out in the red but because of the excellent staff using ways of cutting costs they are now in the black. A motion to approve the budget was made, seconded, and passed. Lion Moon, PID said it was the best newsletter we have had in this District. (report on file)

Journey for Sight: Lion Dan Hurley presented the budget and a motion was made, seconded and approved to accept it. Journey for Sight will be held May 6, 2006 at Fort Story if they approve the date. (report on file)

Committee Reports:

Youth Exchange: Lion Jeff Jacobs reported on the great success of the camp and the bonds that are formed among the exchange students. He also thanked Lion Debbie Ivey, IPDG for all her help. The students were concerned regarding the London bombings and care about what goes on in the world. Lion Jeff would like to speak to more clubs about Youth Exchange to bring in more money.

Achievement Program: Lion Bobbie Carroll read Lion Bill Pope's report regarding the changes made in the Achievement Contest. (report on file)

Audit: Lion Neil Smith reported the books were maintained in a satisfactory manner. A motion was made to accept the audit. It was seconded and passed by the cabinet. (report on file)

Extension: Lion Clayt' Senecal, PDG reported that over the last 20 years we have decreased in membership from 2600 to 1750 and we all have to work hard to turn this around. We need the manpower to meet the needs of our community. Clubs that are having difficulty surviving should think about combining with another club. The goal is to form a branch club in each zone, form three more Clubs and three more Leo Clubs.

Leadership: Lion Jim Oglesby, PDG reported there will be leadership training at the Fall Conference in October. It is hoped that the Region and zones will get together to do new member orientations. The clubs can request leadership programs for their club program. For the new officers, there will be leadership training 22 April 2006 at the Sarah Bonwell Hudgins Center.

Membership: Lion Charlie Cummingham, PDG gave a report on developing a game plan, establishing goals and then implementing and executing the plan for getting new members. (report on file)

Retention: Lion Arlen Eidson, PDG was not present.

Eye Bank: Lion Richard Boone, PDG reported on the 26th Annual Dinner at the Radisson Hotel Hampton Wednesday, August 10, 2005 and encouraged all Lions to attend.

The Cabinet Meeting recessed so the Charity Foundation of District 24-D and the Sight and Hearing Unit could have an Annual Meeting. The Cabinet meeting was resumed.

Lion Sherry Atwood, PDG presented Lion Chet Kramer as a candidate for Vice District Governor for 2006-07.

Lion Debbie Ivey, IPDG presented Lion Dick Knox as a candidate for District Governor for 2006-07. Lion Debbie Ivey, IPDG made a presentation to Lion Bill Noble.

Past Cabinet Secretary, Lion Dave Harris presented Lion Debbie Ivey, IPDG with a District Governor Plaque.

District Governor Barbara Senecal gave her closing remarks.

Lion Charlie Cunningham, PDG gave the benediction.

The meeting was then adjourned.

Lions of Virginia Remote Area Medical Report Wise, Virginia July 29-31, 2005

Thank you to all the volunteers from 24-D who journeyed to this remote corner of Virginia for this year's RAM Project. Those Lions who had been there before knew what wonderful work we do. Those of you who were there for the first time had an eye opening experience. Once again, we surpassed records of previous years, in total, having 6,397 patient encounters in all areas of RAM Project.

Our 24-D Sight and Hearing Van team, along with vans from 24-A and 24-C, using a new joint screening form, screened more than an 1,100 patients in the 3-day period. 710 of these patients required complete eye exams by a team of Ophthalmologists and Optometrists along with residents from UVA and support personnel. This provided over 700 requests for our 24-D Eye Glass Recycling Center team and our opticians who fit these patients from our stock of recycled eyeglasses, or made new ones at the RAM Mobile Lens Lab.

Our District "thank you" would not be complete without recognizing the contribution by Lombart Instrument Company of Norfolk who, for the 5th year, provided all the equipment for the complete eye exams. What we do would not be possible on the scale required if it were not for Rick and Ken Lombart.

Finally, I want to personally thank the Clubs and all the Lions from our District who have supported me in my effort as RAM Chairman to build this program over the past 5 years. Without your dedication and willingness to give of your time, talent and funds, there would be many in Southwest Virginia without the ability to see, read, or achieve at school.






