USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum

Over the years I've heard Lions *enthusiastically* talk about their experiences at the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum. Now I know why... wow, what a fantastic leadership development opportunity! When I registered to attend the Forum, I had three clear objectives in mind. First, I believe it's imperative for us to learn all we can about the new LCI strategic plan so we can hit the ground running in 2017 – 2018. There will be several announcements at the International Convention in Chicago; first and foremost will be the announcement of a new service platform. LCI isn't sharing what this new focus area will be in advance so we'll just need to be prepared to be flexible. The strategic plan, known as LCI Forward, outlines a goal of serving 200 million individuals annually, world-wide, by the year 2020. One key component of this objective is for all clubs to report their service activities into MyLCI service reports. Integrating new technologies and promoting Lionism in innovative ways are other new goals. An app is in development to encourage episodic volunteers to serve on community projects alongside Lions. If our district is to thrive in the future, we must consider ways to implement these changes in Southeastern Virginia. For example, the Forum went green this year by utilizing a new technology called Poken Paw. Each participant was given a "paw" and asked to setup a personal website through the Poken system in advance of the Forum. The "paw" was actually a sophisticated thumb drive and digital information exchange system. Two attendees could touch paws together and when the light turned green you just completed a name and contact information exchange. No business cards required. During training classes touch points were passed around and you touched your paw to the system and the entire course materials including PowerPoints were uploaded to your Poken website. This is just one of the waves of the future - how are we preparing ourselves and our clubs to keep up with these new trends? Second, I wanted the opportunity to speak with the International Directors to learn more about them and select a guest for our 2017 Fall Conference. This goal was accomplished. An invitation has been extended to ID Jennifer Ware from Michigan to visit us next September. She will be a great fit for our district because she serves on the LCI Service Committee and will be able to address future LCI service platform changes. Third, I attended a meeting with 1st Vice President Dr. Naresh Aggarwal designed for 1st Vice District Governors. Dr. Aggarwal outlined the coursework that will begin in October and be completed at the District Governor Elect School in June. I believe Lions can expect some new ideas and a more international perspective in the future. Other highlights from the conference included three motivational speakers, a message from our International President Chancellor Bob Corlew and four Centennial Service Projects. Lions bagged 100,000 meals in just two hours for distribution to families in need in Omaha, NE. A special congratulations to PDG Lion Donna Weiler who taught a class on the use of the spot and our district children's eye screening program. Next year the Forum will be held in Portland, OR and in Columbus, OH in 2018. If you can't attend a Forum, you can still take advantage of the training classes offered by USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum at lionsuniversity.org. Check it out today.

It's the "sensible side" that says NO, it's dangerous, it's expensive, it's humiliating, it's too much work, we don't have enough people, we tried that once – it can't happen. Patti says the likelihood of people making a change in their life is 1 in 9. Even if that change is needed to save the person's life 1 in 9! Patti's message is that it is possible to make the change you want and you already know how to do it with just 3 bold steps – SEE IT, BELIEVE IT, ACT ON IT! 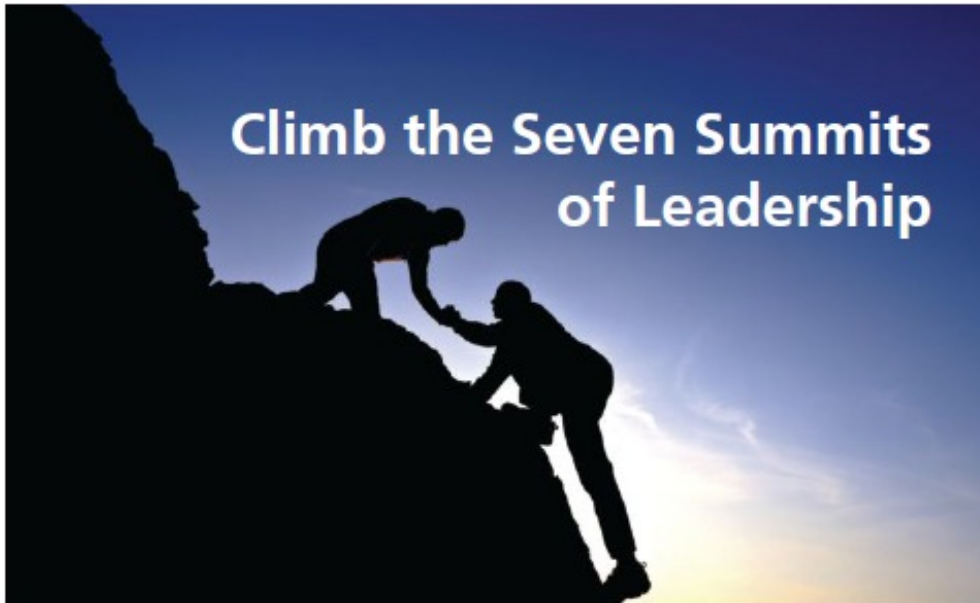
LCI Legal has determined that the MD24 Redistricting proposal voted-on during the May 2016 State Convention was in-fact approved by the delegates 154-110-2.

As such the redistricting proposal will be considered by the LCI Board of Directors for review and approval during their October 16th meeting.

The original proposal has a requested effective date of 1 July 2018, but that LCI Board may not accept our effective date and instead force a 1 July 2017 effective date. I believe they will approve 2018, but it is their decision.

We will know more following the October 16th meeting.

Climb the Seven Summits of Leadership

International President Bob Corlew's theme, "New Mountains to Climb," takes inspiration from the life lessons gained from scaling mountains, both real and metaphorical. As Lions prepare to reach new heights, strong leaders are needed to help clubs stay on course, weather rocky terrain and enjoy the view. "To climb to the top of a mountain, you need the right tools. You also need the right tools to become an effective leader," says Corlew.

LCI offers an array of leadership development resources to help any Lion reach peak performance. Get geared up at the virtual base camp, the Lions Learning Center (LLC), where online courses help Lions climb what the Leadership Development Division at LCI Headquarters calls the "Seven Summits of Leadership." For each of the following "summits," a corresponding LLC online course is listed. Register and take these courses in the Member Center at lionsclubs.org.

1. **Develop a vision.** Determine what being a leader means to you and what you want to accomplish. Course: Writing Your Personal Mission Statement
2. **Be prepared.** Setting clear goals from the get-go enables leaders to achieve results. Course: Goal Setting
3. **Develop judgment.** Gather the knowledge needed and factor in key variables to make informed decisions. Course: Decision Making
4. **Gain commitment.** Use strategies to build on each club member's personal motivation and create a committed team with improved results. Course: Team Motivation
5. **Build a team.** Know what goes into energizing a great team and evaluate your club for continuous improvements. Course: Effective Teams
6. **Encourage openness.** Stimulate creativity and create a club environment that supports new ideas. Course: Promoting Innovation
7. **Demonstrate "We Serve."** Look to the needs of club members and find ways to help them achieve their service goals and develop as Lions. Course: Servant Leadership

Read President Corlew's "New Mountains to Climb" theme.

"Our leadership development programs, tools, and resources have enhanced the skills of thousands of Lions around the world, preparing them not only to effectively address challenges but also to anticipate those challenges as well. Whether your preference is face-to-face training or technology-based learning, LCI offers something for everyone. I encourage you to climb even higher by taking advantage of the various training and development opportunities offered by LCI and the GLT."
