## Lions of Virginia, District 24-D Southampton Middle School Students **Receive Life Changing Visual Equipment!**

## 24-D Lions at Work

On Thursday, June 1, 2017, in the educational halls of Southampton Middle school, students Traleya Eley and Taron Ray were presented with "Life Changing" visual equipment courtesy of Lions of District 24D with help from the District Charity Foundation. Lions clubs represented were Franklin, Windsor, York and Little Creek. This equipment allows visually impaired Trayleya and Taron to read information presented in the classroom on their individual iPads and is crucial to their early educational development and preparation for high school.

In December of 2016, the Lions Charity Foundation of District 24D, Inc., (LCF24D) received a grant request from the Franklin Lions Club to purchase visual enhancement equipment called the E-Bot Pro and a Mojo Electronic Monocular & Docking Stand. This equipment was needed by two legally blind Southampton Middle School students. The grant concept for nearly \$7,000 was presented and approved the following month at the Lions Charity Foundation guarterly board of directors meeting.

It was necessary to clarify the need, verify the specifics, and define how LCF24D could best provide help. To do this the Grants Committee, led by Jerry Phelps, met with the Franklin Lions Club and teacher of the Blind and Visually Impaired, Mr. Murray Newman, M.A., M.ED. In addition, reports were furnished by Duke Medical School, Hampton Roads Eye Associates and Virginia Eye Consultants clarifying the students' needs, as well as, benefits and necessity of the requested equipment. Each report assisted with the evaluation process. At this point, it was learned that the Bovkins Lions Club, as well as, the Franklin Lions Club had been helping the students by furnishing visual supplies and paying for Doctors' visits, since some of the doctors would not accept FAMIS Health Insurance. The parents of the students also provided financial information to help with the decision and evaluation process.

Other coordinated efforts were made involving individuals knowledgeable of vision assistance equipment procedures and capabilities. Advice and guidance from 1st Vice District Governor Beth Stevens, Lion Bill Potter at the Lions of Virginia Foundation (LOVF) and the Virginia Department of the Blind were included in the mix.

At the final coordination and evaluation meeting on May 2, 2017 the participants met to evaluate the reports. Murray Newman expressed his willingness to assist the students for the duration of their enrollment in the Southampton School System and the Franklin Lions Club agreed to purchase needed sunglasses that were included on the equipment list. Now, all that remained to accomplish was to achieve the best price possible for the needed equipment. Through the committed work of Lion Jerry Phelps, LCF Grants Chairperson, a lower price was negotiated. Following numerous emails and telephone calls, the final cost of the E-Bot Pro and Mojo with stand was reduced to \$5,735. The cost was over \$1,000 below the initial figures.

A camera 'reads' information on the board in a classroom or placed on a document tray and captures it as a document that then pops up on the student's iPad. The 'Mojo' is a high- resolution eyepiece that puts large print on a screen in pristine, sharp lettering."
