We Serve: Diabetes Awareness



The incidence of diabetes and prediabetes presents an excellent opportunity for Lions to serve their community.

Recently, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimated that approximately 30.3 million people of all ages - or 9.4% of the U.S. population - had diabetes in 2015. This number continues to rise alarmingly each year.

Approximately 84 million American adults - more than 1 out of 3 - have prediabetes. Of those with prediabetes, 90% do not know they have it.

Prediabetes puts one at risk of developing type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. A person with prediabetes can make lifestyle changes to prevent or delay type 2 diabetes and other serious health problems. However, if someone is unaware they have prediabetes it is unlikely they will get more exercise, change their diet and/or lose weight.

Lions have an opportunity to serve members of our community by identifying their risk for type 2 diabetes. We may:

- Offer risk assessment forms at health fairs, or to those screened at sight and hearing events. Be aware of where to refer those uninsured and underinsured. (CDC's risk assessment form is available by copying and pasting the link below into your web browser.) https://www.cdc.gov/diabetes/prevention/pdf/Prediabetes-Risk-Test-Final.pdf
- Schedule and publicize a presentation by a diabetes educator at a local library or other venue. Use healthy snacks and give away items with prevention information printed on them to increase participation.

Let me know how I can help.

- I will be happy to review your project and determine if the District may provide matching funds.
- If you tell me about your projects, I will be able to share ideas with other clubs.

Spotlight on Fall 2019 Club Activity:

Amherst County - Made donations totalling \$5,250 to local organizations; purchased 11 pairs of eyeglasses totalling \$930; collected 76 pairs of eyeglasses.

Charlotte County - Screened vision for 1425 children in Charlotte County Elementary and Middle Schools (125 referrals); worked Miss Janie's Sit'n Sip to support the Barksdale Family Cancer Foundation.

Eastern Virginia Medical School - A vision screening event for adults that promotes eye health and raises community awareness of the causes of preventable vision loss took place at the Denbigh United Presbyterian Church.

James City - Assisting optometrists with patients requiring eye exams at Olde Towne Medical and Dental Center; SPOT vision screening with Suffolk, Franklin, Smithfield, Windsor clubs; collecting trash & debris on Monticello Avenue; organizing and facilitating the collection of plastic bags for donation to an elementary school for recycling into benches with 52.5 pounds of plastic bags collected in January at D.J. Montague Elementary School.

Kenbridge-Victoria - Lion Ollie picks up food for the Victoria Salvation Army to be packaged and given to those in the community in need.

Norfolk Ocean View - An ongoing monthly support group for adults who are living with blindness and/or visual impairment that fosters personal growth, self-determination, peer-to-peer engagement, emotional support, independence and mobility at Norview Baptist Church.

Onancock - Community activity focused on Type 2 diabetes screening at Eastern Shore YMCA. A vision screening event for adults that promotes eye health and raises community awareness of the causes of preventable vision loss at Eastern Shore YMCA.

Varina – The clubs service project was to sort non-perishable foods for the Henrico Christmas Mother Program, the club sorted over 6,000 food items. We had 11 members of the club participating, along with 5 Leos and four other volunteers.

Virginia Beach Bayside - An ongoing monthly support group for adults who are living with blindness and/or visual impairment that fosters personal growth, self- determination, peer-to-peer engagement, emotional support, independence and mobility at Bayside Library.

Virginia Beach Thalia – The club provided "Santa" and Holiday meals for 14 families in need. Members provided Santa to homeless children who were living in shelters.

Williamsburg Host - Volunteers packed grocery bags, provided clothing and housewares to clients in need. Also stocked shelves at FISH, Local Food/Clothes Pantry.
