Important Dates for April

Fellow Lions of 24-I. I hope all is well and the fist few days of Spring are enjoyable. I want to mention a few dates for your consideration.

4 April is the Lions Quest Zoom brief with PID Jerome. The meeting is limited to 100 Lions so sign up early. https://us02web.zoom.us/j/6482879607 (Meeting ID: 648 287 9607)

27-30 April is the State Convention in Bristol. This is where the proposed changes to the MD 24 and the 24-I C&BL Constitution and Bylaws, and policy manual will be voted on. The proposed changes are available at the following links:

Become one of your clubs' delegates and be at the convention to vote.

13 May is the Build a Vision meeting in Providence Forge. It will start at 10 AM and end about 3 PM. We will have something for lunch. More information to follow soon.

The proposed changes to the C&BL's, along with the policy manuals, will help the district function more efficiently and with greater transparency.

In the District and Multiple District we have various policy and procedure manuals from the days of old. These keep popping up at times, because they never cancelled the previous version, and cause confusion because they often are outdated or conflict with each other. If we want to operate efficiently, we need to know what policies we are to follow. Also the COG or District Cabinet can change the policy manual without having to go thorough the process of having an amendment approved at the State Convention.

With the district C&BL we currently have a potential of having about 74 individual positions that count as voting members of the DG Cabinet. Most are single person committee chairs. LCI does not allow club presidents to have a vote, by virtue of being the club president. LCI recommends that the Cabinet be the district Officers, Zone and Region chairs for a total of about 28 Lions. Tying to get 38 of the 74 specific Lions to an event can be challenging. Going the way that LCI suggests we would only need 15 of the 28 specific Lions. If we do not have a quorum, we do not get to pass a budget. We are not allowed to spend money on District projects until we have an approved budget.

The Multiple District 24 C&BL has not been revised since 2020 according to what is posted on the MD24 Website. Since that time LCI has changed the Individual and Multiple District MD Standard / Model C&BL, so we have a number of items that are in conflict with LCI. Some items in the MD C&BL interfere with the DG's ability to manage individual districts.

A number of items should be included in the Policy manual so they can be changed as the need arises.

The bottom line is: these changes are needed to make the management of the MD and District easier and more transparent.

If you have a question, you can submit it on the site or you can email it to me. One questioner wanted to know why changing the voting members of the DG Cabinet was not being done by a vote of the entire district membership. Per our C&BL, changes to the C&BL must be approved by the voting delegates at a Convention. This state convention is where the voting will take place.

Virginia Beach Lions Club Helps Students Facing Hunger Issues Through Beach Bags Drive

It's that time of the year—the Beach Bags drive, an opportunity for the community to drop off food. Thanks to those donations, that food helps families struggling to put food on the table.

One person who helps out in a huge way with the program is Nancy Watters with Virginia Beach Thalia Lions Club. She helps raise money and rounds up volunteers to pack the Beach Bags. News 3 learned she would be attending a Lions Club meeting at Ynot Pizza off Great Neck Road, and that's where News 3 surprised her with an Everyday Hero award.

We told her we've been hearing what she means to the Beach Bags program. Watters is a leading force with the Virginia Beach Thalia Lions Club and while she's not seeking the spotlight. Debbie Hughes, the head of the Beach Bags program is quick to share Nancy's impact. "She corraled over 60 volunteers this past year from the local Lions clubs and they packed in two hours 22-hundred bags," Hughes said.

In addition to the volunteers she coordinates, Nancy also submits an application every year to the Lions charity foundation for thousands of dollars to buy the food for this program.



Watters also helps coordinate a Lions Club vision program to provide free eye screenings for Beach students at the Back to School Care Fair.

For all those reasons News 3 presented Nancy with an Everyday Hero award. Not surprisingly, she didn't want all the credit, "And actually this recognition should go to the entire Lions Club and not just to me." She also received a \$300 Visa gift card from our community partner Southern Bank. "It's amazing! But what's good is, we have money to do a project," she said.
